

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF "CENTERVILLE" GEORGIA AMENDING LICENSE/PERMIT FEES FOR SALES OF BEER AND WINE AND FOR CATERED EVENTS AT WHICH BEER, WINE, AND DISTILLED SPIRITS MAY BE SERVED, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Centerville may, as allowed by the Georgia Constitution and the Laws of the State of Georgia and as authorized by City Code Section 1-5(b) "Amendments to Code", amend the Centerville Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville is a municipality in which alcohol sales are lawful; and

WHEREAS, the governing authority of the City of Centerville has exercised the powers authorized under Georgia law for the issuance of licenses for the sale of beer, wine, and distilled spirits and for the issuance of special event permits to serve beer, wine, and distilled spirits at catered events within the municipal boundaries of the City of Centerville; and

WHEREAS, the governing authority of the City of Centerville has the authority to set license and permit fees for special event permits where beer, wine, and distilled spirits may be served at catered events; then

THEREFORE, be it ordained that the schedule of fees and charges maintained by the city clerk's office shall be amended to reflect changes in the following license/permit fees as set forth below:

Annual alcoholic beverage catering license	\$300.00 per year
Special event permit fee – off premises alcohol catering	\$ 50.00 per event**

(**special event permit fee charged if applicant holds alcoholic beverage catering license from a local government entity other than the City of Centerville; Alcoholic beverage caterers who hold an annual license issued by the City of Centerville must obtain a special event permit for each event, however, Centerville licensees shall not be subject to the separate special event permit fee of \$50.00)


CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: In the event that any ordinance, or any part thereof, of the City of "Centerville", Georgia is in conflict herewith, this ordinance shall have preference.


